EMERGING JAZZ ARTIST AWARD



THE TORONTO ARTS FOUNDATION WOULD LIKE TO CONGRATULATE AMANDA TOSOFF, WINNER OF THE 2016 EMERGING JAZZ ARTIST AWARD.

Amanda Tosoff is a Toronto-based pianist and composer. She has performed with internationally recognized artists like Ingrid Jensen, Emilie-Claire Barlow, Phil Dwyer, Brad Turner, and Kelly Jefferson, and her groups have opened for jazz legends Bobby Hutcherson, Renee Rosnes, Oliver Jones, and Brazilian singer Luciana Souza. Amanda has been awarded such honours as General Motors Grand Prix de Jazz at the 2009 Montréal Jazz Festival, and more recently, a 2014 graduating scholarship from the University of Toronto – an award given out to graduates deemed to have potential to make a contribution to music. On her fifth release,

Words (2016), Amanda took an adventurous leap beyond the confines of conventional jazz. She has taken poems and lyrics that possess a personal resonance for her and framed them in original new compositions that utilize vocals for the first time. The result is an eclectic collection that incorporates elements of art song, classical, folk, and jazz. **amandatosoff.com**

The Emerging Jazz Artist Award furthers the career of an outstanding emerging jazz artist and is intended to support the pre-production, production, and/or recording of original music composed by the recipient. The Emerging Jazz Artist Award is a cash award of \$10,000. Finalists receive \$1,000. The award was established in 2014 through the generous donation of Cheryl and Manuel Buchwald, and will be given out annually for at least 10 years.

East End Arts continues to engage, activate, and support the arts and artists in Toronto's east end. The summer of 2016 will see a wide variety of

creative events and partnered opportunities for participatory arts activities.

My Home Is... at Dawes Crossing - A free community spoken word and poetry performance on July 9 by local participants of an open-call workshop, led by artist Cathy Petch.

Community Mural - East End Arts will work with artist Jim Bravo this summer, who will be painting a community mural on the back wall of the Linsmore Tavern that depicts the past and present streetscape of the site.

ASL: A Storytelling Language - A 6-week pilot program in partnership with the Deaf Community Centre and East End Arts to teach American Sign Language (ASL) through rhythm, rhyming, and stories by instructor and storyteller Mario Pizzacalla for parent and child pairs.

Coxwell Mosaic Mural will be created throughout August along the Danforth-facing wall of the Coxwell TTC subway station with help by the community, and led by artist Cristina Delago. This remarkable collaboration between East End Arts, TTC, StreetART Toronto, the Toronto Parking Authority, and the City of Toronto will beautify and bring art to this high-traffic and pedestrian-friendly space.



Neighbourhood Arts Network and North York Arts, will launch a new program in collaboration with The Legacy Collective, a group of 40 senior community artists. Our support is vital for the continued growth of The Legacy Collective by significant contributions of space, a coordinator salary, guest artist fees and transportation costs. Through the power of the arts, these immigrant and newcomer members use art as a tool to combat sadness, depression, loneliness, illness, and anxiety that comes with living in a new country.

My Art, My New Land is a spark project for this year's Cultural Hotspot in partnership with Airsa Art and Thought Association, City of Toronto, Neighbourhood Arts Network and North York Arts. This free improvisation workshop series which has been created to help newcomer artists face and overcome challenges in a new culture and society, by providing an opportunity to develop communication skills in authentic and dynamic situations

In these workshops, four guest facilitators will tackle a variety of topics with participants, including networking and effective communication, collaboration and, adaptiveness and marketing & branding.

Neighbourhood Arts Network is also busy working on a creative video series showcasing the Five Arts & Equity Principles from our toolkit.
